## Empowering our Writers at Carver Elementary School

The Empowering Writers program teaches students the craft of writing as an outlet for self-expression, creative ideas, sharing information or voicing opinions. The program is based on providing common experiences for students upon which to draw out background knowledge, rich vocabulary, and sensory details to strengthen student writing. Another unique feature of this program is the way in which it highlights "things good authors do" through interactive read-alouds. Students are cued to notice how an author builds suspense through robust vocabulary and word referents, while at the same time identifying the author's purpose and the intended audience.

In the classroom rather than using a formulaic approach where students construct an essay based on a specified structure such as number of paragraphs, teachers model and guide students to take an idea and elaborate on it one step at a time. This program is taught in elements or segments. One week a class may work on brainstorming sensory details and the next week they are incorporating these phrases into a suspense building "opening". Soon, they add adjectives and word referents to lead a reader to a conclusion by "showing not telling". Some lessons conclude with a word splash or a graphic organizer, while others walk a writer through the development of one complete sentence or paragraph.

This innovative approach to writing instruction has been an infusion of creativity and lively thinking. Check out these samples of writing segments, sentences, and paragraphs from Kindergarten, First Grade, and Second Grade. See how our teachers are using this new approach to writing instruction to empower your young writers!

### Samples of students' writing:

"My Grampi hips me rid my bick." **Kindergarten sample**

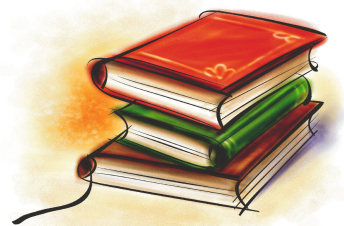
