Dear Families,

On February 9, 2012, we will have reached the 100<sup>th</sup> day of school! Time seems to be flying by quicker than ever. Our Elementary School is buzzing with the wonderful sounds of learning. For many students, so much of what they have been working on suddenly begins to make sense and they begin to put all their skills together. We are proud of the effort and progress our students are making. Thank you for your support in making school a priority.

### READING INITIATIVES

There will be two reading initiatives taking place during the winter and spring. Thank you to all the parents who encourage and support their children with reading every day even during school vacation.

- Kindergarten, Grade 1 and Grade 2 students will have the opportunity to participate in the vacation reading initiative during February vacation. Reading logs will be going home with the students on Friday, February 17. Students who read during the February vacation should complete the reading log and return it to school. These students will receive a book and certificate. Reading logs must be returned to school by Friday, March 2. We have listed all the December readers in this newsletter.
- Grades 3, 4, and 5 students will have the opportunity to participate in our READ-A-THON to promote and foster reading in school and at home. The READ-A-THON will begin on Monday, February 27 and end on Monday, April 9. Students who participate every week will earn a reading award in June. A letter explaining the details will be sent home with the students before February vacation.

### SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Please make every effort to have your child attend school every day. It is important for your child to understand that good attendance and getting to school on time is necessary to succeed in school. We have attached the Attendance/Vacation section from the Student Handbook for your review.

### **LOST AND FOUND**

The items in our lost and found area are increasing daily. If your child is missing an item of clothing-hats, mittens, etc., please check the lost and found area located in the front foyer in the Erwin K. Washburn lower building and near the cafeteria in the Gov. John Carver upper building.

### **MORNING DROP OFF**

For the safety of all students and staff, we respectfully request your cooperation with this procedure. If you are dropping off a 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> grade student, please do so at the Governor John Carver Building Cafeteria. If you are dropping off a Kindergarten, grade 1, grade 2 or grade 3 student, please do so in the side parking lot and be sure your child walks on the sidewalk, **NOT BETWEEN THE BUSES**. We understand that this procedure may take a little longer when dropping your student(s) off, but it will ensure the safety of all.

### **ATTENDANCE**

A student is tardy if he/she arrives late to school (i.e., later than the official school starting time of 8:15 a.m.). In such cases, the student **and** parent must report directly to the office before the student can go to the classroom. Parents **must** sign their children in at the office.

**Early Dismissal:** If a child is to be dismissed early from school, a note must be brought or sent in on the day of dismissal, explaining the reason for dismissal and the time to be dismissed. Only a signed note by a parent or legal guardian is acceptable. A parent or guardian must be present for the school to release a child, unless a signed note from the parent or legal guardian allows the release of the child to another adult. Every student must be signed out from the school office or health office. Parents or guardians must report to the office and not go directly to the classroom. The child will be called from the classroom for dismissal. Please allow sufficient time for your child to gather his/her belongings from the classroom before they are dismissed. Identification will be required. For student safety, telephone calls to the office to change dismissal procedures will not be permitted except for cases of extreme emergency.

**End of Day Dismissal:** A parent who wishes his/her child to be dismissed (rather than taking the bus home) needs to send in a signed note to the office. If a student is to be dismissed daily, a permanent note may be written and sent to the school office. Parents who pick up a child at the end of the school day are to park in the rear of the EKW building in front of the cafeteria where parking spaces have been reserved for parents. Parents may enter the cafeteria at 2:35 p.m. Students will be called to the cafeteria at 2:40 p.m. Students **MUST** be signed out at the cafeteria by a parent/guardian. If the parent/guardian is unable to dismiss the child, a signed note by the parent must be sent in with the child stating who will be allowed to dismiss the child. Identification will be required.

Similar to attendance policies, the fewer times a child is released from school, the better it is for his/her education. A student will be considered absent from school if he/she arrives after or leaves before the mid-point (11:30 AM) of any school day.

Excessive tardiness or early dismissal will be followed up by the school administration, may be investigated by the attendance officer, and may result in poor academic performance, which could lead to retention.

### **ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PLAYGROUND FUNDRAISER**

Mutual Bank in Carver is sponsoring a contest to benefit the Carver Elementary School playground as part of the bank's celebration of 33 years in town.

Visitors to the Carver branch at 74 Main Street will see a big "Crystal Box" full to the brim with golf tees. The bank has challenged Carver residents to come in and guess the number of tees in the box. The contest began Friday, January 20. The person with the closest guess will receive a \$100 prize. 

## CARVER ELEMENTARY PTO

It is hard to believe that we are almost half way through the 2011/2012 school year! With that said, we thought it would be a good time to share with you the monies raised thus far, through all of our fundraising efforts. We have been busy and are working hard to ensure that the students are provided with the tools needed to have the best learning experience possible. Below is a list of all of the fundraisers that have occurred in this school year. We have compared this year's results with last year's.



**We are happy to report that we have raised, so far this year (2011/2012 school year), \$20,560.** That is amazing as last year at this time we were at \$14,387. The Artwork and Winter Wonderland did not raise as much money as last year but we doubled the profit from the Cristoline sales! Also, we did not have the Red Robin "Restaurant Night Outs" last year. The Paper Retriever, Bag2School and Target programs were introduced mid-year last year so you will not see a comparison of that profit just yet. We have also rolled out another new program, the Stop & Shop A+ Rewards program where we have currently raised, \$348.32 (this money will not be received until April as the program runs through March and hopefully the amount will continue to grow).

Last year we committed to offering new programs where we aren't asking families for money. So we introduced the Paper Retriever, Bag2School, Target and Stop & Shop A+ programs. We are committed to pursuing these types of programs. Other similar programs already in place are: Box Tops, the Juice Pouch Brigade and Labels For Education.

Speaking of Labels for Education, Labels for Education is having a huge promo and we need you to send in all your labels (UPC codes) from the participating products. A list will be sent home shortly. Please send in by February 29, 2012. This promotion is how we are able to provide all of the recess equipment for the students.

### Kindergarten Registration

The Carver Elementary School will be holding kindergarten registration appointments on the following days by appointment only:

Friday, 3/2/12	Monday, 3/5/12	Wednesday, 3/7/12	Thursday, 3/8/12
Friday, 3/9/12	Tuesday, 3/13/12	Thursday, 3/15/12	

➤ Only children who will be 5 years old on or before **September 1, 2012** are eligible to enroll in kindergarten per Carver Public Schools' entrance age policy.

Parents/guardians need to call the EKW Building to make an appointment to register and for a hearing/vision screening appointment beginning on Monday, January 30, 2012 between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. The phone number is 866-6210. Please note that due to the winter recess, February 20 through February 24, 2012, the office will be closed. After receiving your appointment, a kindergarten registration packet will be mailed to you promptly. In order to register, you need to bring **all completed** forms and the following:

- The child's certified birth certificate (with a raised seal on it).
- Proof of residency. The following is the only acceptable proof of residency: Purchase and sales of house/condo, two consecutive months of a utility bill, rental agreement including landlords contact information. A driver's license will be accepted with one of the above items listed.
- Up-to-date immunizations.

Failure to provide this information will delay the placement of your child.

An evening orientation will be held in the spring at the Carver Elementary School IMC. At this time, information about our kindergarten program will be presented. Details (including date and time) will be given out at registration.

Please note that students who currently attend the Carver Public Schools' Preschool Program are required to register for kindergarten, if they are age appropriate.
