## Kindergarten Registration for the 2012-2013 School Year

The Carver Elementary School will be holding kindergarten registration on the following days **by appointment only**:

➤ Only children who will be 5 years old on or before **September 1, 2012** are eligible to enroll in kindergarten per Carver Public Schools' entrance age policy.

Parents/guardians need to call the EKW Building to make an appointment to register and for a hearing/vision screening appointment beginning on Monday, January 30, 2012 between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. The phone number is 866-6210. Please note that due to the winter recess, February 20 through February 24, 2012, the office will be closed. After receiving your appointment, a kindergarten registration packet will be mailed to you promptly. In order to register, you need to bring **all completed forms and** the following:

- The child's certified birth certificate (with a raised seal on it).
- Proof of residency. The following is the only acceptable proof of residency: Purchase and sales of house/condo, two consecutive months of a utility bill, rental agreement including landlords contact information. A driver's license will be accepted with one of the above items listed.
- Up-to-date immunizations.

Failure to provide this information will delay the placement of your child.

An evening orientation will be held in the spring in the EKW Building Cafeteria. At this time, information about our kindergarten program will be presented. Details (including date and time) will be given out at registration.

Please note that students who currently attend the Carver Public Schools' Preschool Program are required to register for kindergarten, if they are age appropriate.
