Morning Drop off-Your cooperation is essential in order for our morning drop-off procedure to remain safe and to function efficiently. Remember that it is not necessary for parents to get out of the car while in the drop-off lane. If you must get out of your car, park in the designated parking area and walk your child into the GJC cafeteria. We do understand that on occasion, it may be necessary to drive your child to school. However, we strongly encourage parents to have their child ride the bus to school most of the time.

School Elections-Students in Grades 1-5 will be participating in a student election on November 5. Students will cast their vote for President/Vice President and Massachusetts State Senate. In addition, students will be asked to place their vote for a school mascot. We have received many suggestions for our elementary school mascot and the two most popular will be placed on the

ballot. All students, including Kindergarten students, will cast their vote for our school mascot.

Food Drive-The Carver Elementary School community is once again participating in a food drive. We will be accepting non-perishable food items from November 19th-November 30th. Children can drop off their donations in the bins located at the entrance of both the GJC and EKW buildings. All donations will be given to the local food pantry.

Math Intervention-Based on the success of our Response to Intervention model for Literacy, we have outlined a plan for math that offers a similar type of support. At Carver Elementary School, we believe that in today's mathematics classrooms, students and teachers should be part of a mathematical community working closely together to solve problems. We understand that students do best when they not only receive math instruction specific to the curriculum but also receive targeted small group support when necessary. Math intervention will take place during the latter part of the math block. Support staff will be working with small groups of students in or nearby the classroom to begin to implement this model within our school community.

New Educator Evaluation-On June 28, 2011, the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education adopted new regulations for the evaluation of all Massachusetts educators. The new regulations apply to all teachers, principals, superintendents, and other staff in positions that require an Elementary and Secondary Education (ESE) issued license. Carver Elementary has begun the process of implementing training for faculty. Scheduled trainings for Carver Elementary School Educator Evaluation are:
