Morning Drop-off


Thank you to all the parents and/or families that have contributed to making our morning drop-off a huge success. We continue to encourage all children to ride the bus. Remember that drop-off begins at 8:00 A.M. and the gate closes at 8:25. Anyone dropping off after 8:25 will have to bring their child into the school and sign the child in as a late arrival. Our classroom teachers are beginning their morning activities promptly at 8:15 A.M. At this point in the school year, we believe children are able to disembark on their own and walk themselves into the cafeteria. If you are walking your child in, you must park near the ball field. Supervision is on hand and an adult faculty member will take the younger children to the EKW building.

MCAS NEWS

All students in grades 3, 4 and 5 were tested on MCAS this past spring. Carver Elementary demonstrated improvement in MCAS across the board. The most significant growth is noted in Grade 5 Mathematics with 69% of students performing in the Proficient and Advanced category. This is an increase of 16% from the previous year. While the Spring 2012 results indicate we are making steady progress, we will continue to analyze our data closely to assess all areas and provide student support where necessary. Congratulations to all our teachers at Carver Elementary for their dedication to our students. It is through the hard work, team work and commitment to student success of our entire staff and faculty that our students continue to thrive!

Having Successful Parent-Teacher Conferences

It doesn't matter if you're the student, the teacher, or the parent, parent-teacher conferences are bound to cause some anxiety. Yet these one-on-one meetings are priorities opportunities for families to get a better understanding of their children. By preparing well for your meetings with teachers and following up with both your children and their teachers afterward, you can strengthen your children's school success.

Before the Conference:

Listen. Any time you hear your child talking about something he or she is doing really well in or is having

trouble with—either with schoolwork or with classmater—make a note of it. When it's time for the confinence with the teacher, you'll have a menty-made list of things to forms.
