

Character Trait of the Month: Kindness

During the month of December, students at Carver Elementary School will be learning about kindness within their classrooms. Kindness is showing concern about the well-being and feelings of others. **Our CES students think "kindness" is:**

"Kindness is helping others, being good, listening to others, being the best you can be." (Joshua- Grade 2)

"Kindness is being a friend to everyone, using manners and being considerate." (Nolan- Grade 3)



"Kindness is a helping hand. It's as simple as sending a smile to someone who is sad." (Faith- Grade 2)

"Kindness is when you help someone up. It can also be when you think about other people first. You can listen to people to be kind." (Aidan- Grade 3)

"Kindness is someone being nice. They are doing the thing that they are asked to do. They might let someone use their pencil." (Lucy- Grade 2)

"Kindness is a choice, it is an act and a feeling. Kindness is appreciated it is noticeable. Kindness is making people laugh when they are sad. Kindness is respect." (Tori- Grade 5)

"Kindness is being nice to each other every day." (Kathleen-Grade 3)

"Kindness means to show an act or words of caring and friendliness to another person other than yourself." (Anonymous Grade 4)

"Kindness is sticking up for others." (Aaron -Grade 3)

"Kindness means to help other people with kind acts like by inviting somebody to play a game if you see them playing alone." (Kaylee- Grade 4)

"Kindness is caring, helping, understanding and it also means the opposite of harm. " (Anonymous- Grade 3)

"...the people who have a heart trigger kindness but you can trigger kindness too, so go ahead and spread kindness through everyone; throughout the world so go ahead and make some warm hearts by spreading kindness." (Ethan - Grade 5)

What does kindness **look** like? People who are kind:

- Treat everyone fairly
- Show concern when someone is sad
- Take care of the environment
- Refuse to tease or ridicule others

What does kindness **sound** like? People who are kind may say things like:

- "How can I help?"
- "Do you want to join us?"
- "Are you okay?"
- "I'm sorry that I hurt your feelings."

<u>Kindness is Cooler, Mrs. Ruler</u> by: Margorie Cuyler (To get her kids to be more kind, Mrs. Ruler gives an assignment to do 5 acts of kindness.)
