Office Hours with the Principal

Office Hours with the Principal are from 7:30-7:50 every morning and/or by scheduling a meeting. Also, to provide feedback, suggestions or comments regarding any/all aspects of our school day, there is a comment box located near the parent waiting area in the EKW building. Remember that if you are trying to reach the principal or one of the associate principals during the school day, we are throughout the school, getting to know all our students, conducting classroom walkthroughs, and supporting our teachers. If you leave us a message, we will make sure to get back to you within 24 hours. For emergencies, please do not hesitate to let our office administrative assistants know that you need to speak with one of us immediately.

ROLE MODEL SCREENINGS

The Carver Public Schools' Preschool Program, located at the Carver Elementary School, will begin scheduling appointments on Monday, April 3, 2017, for screenings for role model slots for the 2017-2018 school year. Screenings will begin April 14 and continue through May 12.

A screening is required for acceptance into the program. Children considered are those who do not currently receive special education services and are not in need of special education services. Applicants are expected to demonstrate age appropriate skills (within 6 months) in the areas of speech and language, cognitive/school readiness, fine and gross motor development, and social/emotional and behavioral development. In addition, a child must be at least 3 years of age by September 1, 2017 and toilet trained. They must also be a resident of Carver and families must provide transportation to and from the program. Those children found eligible will be entered into a lottery. Appropriate role model students who are not selected in the lottery will be placed on a waiting list. Please note that slots are limited.

This program for role model students is a fee based program. We offer 2, 3, and 4 half day sessions; the fee for each half day is \$12.00.

Next Generation MCAS

This April and May, Carver Elementary students in grades 3-5 will be participating in the Next Generation MCAS assessment. The ELA and Math assessments will be computer based. There will be a stronger alignment to the Massachusetts learning standards and new items on this assessment will more deeply assess both skills and knowledge. The grade 5 Science & Technology assessment will remain paper based. Testing dates for each grade level are below.


Best of the Bunch Brunch was held on Thursday, March 30. Parents were invited to enjoy this special morning with their student.






Accepting Differences Program
