Stay Home When Sick/COVID-19 Symptoms

- Key Message Stay Home When Sick
- Unvaccinated individuals presenting with the COVID-19 symptoms should stay home and can not return to school until they:
 - Have a negative PCR or rapid COVID-19 test
 - 2. Have improvement of symptoms
 - 3. Have been fever free for 24 hours without medication

COVID-19 Symptoms

- FEVER (100 Or ABOVE)
- DIFFICULTY BREATHING
- NEW LOSS OF TASTE OR SMELL
- MUSCLE ACHES OR BODY ACHES

When in Combination with other symptoms on the list

- Cough
- Sore throat
- Nausea
- Headache
- Fatigue
- Nasal congestions/runny nose

Stay Home When Sick/COVID-19 Symptoms

- Key Message Stay Home When Sick
- Vaccinated individual presenting with the COVID-19 symptoms should stay home and can not return to school until they:
 - 1. Have improvement of symptoms

Unless they have one of the bolded symptoms then they have to follow the same protocol as unvaccinated individuals

COVID-19 Symptoms

- FEVER (100 Or ABOVE)
- DIFFICULTY BREATHING
- NEW LOSS OF TASTE OR SMELL
- MUSCLE ACHES OR BODY ACHES

When in Combination with other symptoms on the list

- Cough
- Sore throat
- Nausea
- Headache
- Fatigue
- Nasal congestions/runny nose

Individual who Tests Positive for COVID-19

- Self isolation for a minimum of 10 days
- Return to school is based on time and symptom resolution
 Repeat testing is not required or recommended to return
- After 10 days you can return to school provided:
 - Fever free for 24 hours
 - Experienced improvement in symptoms
 - Return to school is based on time and symptom resolution. Repeat testing is not required or recommended to return

Close Contact Protocols

• Close contact: anyone who has been with in 6 feet of a person for more than 15 cumulative minutes while indoors during the positive person's infectious period (48 hours from the time of the person beginning to feel ill or testing positive)

Close Contacts Exempt from Testing and Quarantine Protocols

- **1.** Asymptomatic, fully vaccinated individuals
- 2. Classroom Close Contacts: An individual who is exposed to a COVID-19 positive individual in the classroom while **both** individuals were masked as long as desk are spaced at least 3 feet apart
- No Close Contacts on the bus because student are required to wear a mask on the bus
- **4.** Close contacts who have had COVID-19 within the past 90 days

Close Contacts

Where Can it Happen

- Athletics when inside
- In the Hallway Small Exposure
- Lunch
- Gym
- In General Non-Classroom Spaces

Close Contact Option 1: Test and Stay

Duration - 7 Days from Exposure to the positive individual **Return to School** - Can remain in school as long as:

- → Asymptomatic
- → Wear a mask at all times
- → Take a rapid test in the nurse's office daily and test negative
- → Self-monitor symptoms for 14 days

Close Contact Option: 2/3

OPTION 2

Duration - Quarantine for 7 days from the date of exposure **Return to School** - Return to school on day 8 as long as:

- → Asymptomatic
- → Received a negative rapid or PCR test on day 5 or later after exposure
- → Self-monitor for 14 days

OPTION 3

Duration - Quarantine for 10 days from the date of exposure (No testing required) **Return to School** - Return to school on day 11 as long as:

- → Asymptomatic
- → Self-monitor for 14 days

Social Distancing



- Guidance is to do the best you can to maintain 3 feet in classrooms and cafeteria
- In most classrooms we will be 3 feet or more
- Keep desks in classrooms at the Elementary Level
- Maintain desks in Elementary Cafeteria facing forward 6 feet apart
- Return to tables in MHS Cafeteria
- Keep Assigned Seating in Cafeterias

Social Distancing/Health and Safety



- No Lockers at the MHS
- Monitor Bathroom Usage
- Maintain one-way stairways at MHS
- Hand Sanitizer stations set-up throughout the buildings
- Wipes will be widely available for teachers

Symptomatic Testing - Pool Testing

- We will continue optional testing of symptomatic students during the school day
- We will implement test and stay as needed
- Weekly Pool Testing for Staff
- Survey Parents about Pool Testing for Students
