Community and School

Situated in a growing, rural community in southeastern Massachusetts, Carver Middle High School serves 371 students, grades 9-12. The well maintained building and grounds, constructed in 1987, offer exceptional opportunities for teaching and learning.

Equipped with a language laboratory, a planetarium and spacious classrooms, Carver Middle High School offers a strong academic program as well as opportunities for student involvement in a wide-range of athletic and co-curricular activities. The guidance staff provides both post-secondary education and career counseling. In addition, Ramsay Library Media Center is a welcoming place that is frequently used by students and staff to research, study, read, create, and collaborate. The library provides a wide range of materials, technologies, and other information services in support of the school's curriculum.

Carver Middle High School currently operates on a block schedule of four 85 minute blocks each semester. Students and staff have welcomed the higher standards set by the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education through the Curriculum Frameworks, finding ever increasing opportunities to improve instruction and student learning. Carver Middle High School is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges.

Carver Middle High School offers four levels of study in a variety of courses. Students may study some courses at College Preparatory 2, College Preparatory, Honors, or Advanced Placement Level. Enrollment for each level is based on teacher and department chair recommendation.

Final grades are reported numerically.

The baseline for the calculation of G.P.A. at Carver Middle High School is based on grades earned in College Prepatory classes taken only at Carver Middle High School. These grades are converted by computer to a 4.0 scale. Because of the increased demands and rigor of Honors and Advanced Placement classes, these classes are given additional weight on the 4.0 scale. Grades earned in Honors classes are given an additional weight of 0.5. Grades earned in Advanced Placement are given an additional 1.0. Grades earned in Applied classes are converted to 0.5 below the conversion for grades earned in college preparatory classes. Only grades earned in courses labeled as College Preparatory 2, College Prepatory, Honors or Advanced Placement are used in calculation of G.P.A. Class rank is computed at the end of junior year and after each quarter of senior year.
