Provide informational assemblies and resources for students, faculty, and families around the topics of social media, bullying, and inclusion. Explore new strategies to enhance the use of Restorative Justice Practices and Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports for students. Offer an informational meeting for 6th Grade parents during 6th Grade Student Orientation in August to support families in the transition to middle school.	Expand partnerships with local businesses and organizations to support school-wide initiatives including senior internships and innovative pathways. Continue to promote Carver Pathways Programs and Project Based Learning through district-wide student/community showcases and events. Continue to develop and promote the CMHS Parent Teacher Organization (PTO), to include students and parents of all grade levels and create annual fundraisers. Explore the expansion of partnerships with the community through the Community Garden Project and Culinary Program. Develop an alumni organization and process to maintain communication with our graduates and foster relationships between alumni and current students. Continue to provide professional development opportunities for staff to explore current grading policies to ensure consistency and equity as aligned with Vision of the Graduate. Promote Pathways Program by reviewing/ enhancing the curriculum of term-based 8th grade Exploratory courses. Expand the use of interactive learning spaces (Greenhouse, TV Studio, Culinary Room) into our curriculum. Continue to expand Pathways courses: Sustainable Agriculture, MET Capstone, PLTW, and Clean Energy. Provide dual enrollment opportunities for college-bound students through a partnership with Massasoit Community College. Provide professional development for staff and training for students in diversity, equity, and inclusion.	Continue to collaborate with the district to apply for programmatic funding (grants) to expand and develop pathways opportunities. Continue collaboration with COFO to implement the five-year facility plan to support building-based initiatives such as classroom modernization and building improvements.
