Teaching you to know the warning signs, know what to say, what not to say. How to listen nonjudgmentally and help someone get professional help.


Ask the Question - Save a Life

Through its South Shore Family Network (SSFN), South Shore Community Action Council (SSCAC) promotes early literacy and provides family supports for South Shore families residing in the following 11 towns: Carver, Cohasset, Duxbury, Halifax, Hanover, Hingham, Kingston, Norwell, Pembroke, Plympton and Scituate. Funded by a Coordinated Family & Community Engagement grant from the Massachusetts Department of Early Education and Care (EEC), the SSFN program hosts community-based child and family activities throughout the year including: *Children's literacy events, *Parenting workshops and Parent/grandparent-toddler play groups. In addition, the SSFN staff serves as an information and referral resource for parents seeking information about childcare and a range of family support services.



The SSFN CFCE program is funded through the MA Department of Early Education and Care


