Intervention


Teaching you to know the warning signs, know what to say, what not to say. How to listen nonjudgmentally and help someone get professional help.



Funded by a Coordinated Family & Community Engagement grant from the Massachusetts Department of Early Education and Care (EEC), the SSFN program hosts community-based child and family activities throughout the year including: *Children's literacy events, *Parenting workshops and Parent/grandparent-toddler play groups. In addition, the SSFN staff serves as an information and referral resource for parents seeking information about childcare and a range of family support services.


